Learn about various types of unusual fruit and berries that grow well in USDA zone 6 Connecticut. Dan Furman will focus on the landscape/ecological place filled by these plants in addition to the interesting fruit.

The lecture includes information on pawpaws, persimmons, quince, Asian pears, and elderberries to name a few. Plant cultivation, as well as pest and disease issues and propagation will round out the talk.
